The Yucaipa Valley Art Association will host multi-media artist, Christine White, at the October 16th meeting, where she will share her art techniques and story telling to create some fascinating art!

Christine is a Redlands-based artist working in paint and mixed media. She has lived all over the United States and appreciates what makes different regions unique and special. Her interest in conveying a sense of place is imbued in her work, and supported by a professional background and Masters in Geography. Christine's art tends to portray surreal stories of places, plants, and creatures. Lately, she has been creating art using materials we normally discard: plastic, fabric scraps, old wiring. Hiding this assembled core under paper mâché and careful painting, the pieces are metaphors for standing with nature and saying "enough" to the overwhelming consumption of our day.

A year ago, Christine started a songwriting project that morphed into a story, which now lives in her head nearly 24/7. Christine is slowly creating the body of artwork to accompany it and will share the first few pieces at YVAA on Thursday, October 16th. This artwork collection features native animals, a passion for fashion, and a rattlesnake goddess; it's the beginning of a pretty wild ride for her art. Christine will also demo some of the mixed media techniques that are helping build out this world.

Join us for Christine's presentation called **"Stoked About a Story"** on Thursday, October 16th at 7:00 pm at the Scherer Community Center, 12202 1st Street, Yucaipa, CA. Free admission.

- Up to three (3) original pieces can be submitted.
- Maximum size is 26"H x 26" W including frame.
- Complete the application for each artwork submitted.
- Submit application(s) with digital photos or print photos of artwork to both YVAA and the YPAC.

This summer we had four board members exit YVAA board positions. While we have filled some board member positions, we have others that are still vacant this fall. Below is a list of some of the open positions. Volunteer help is always needed and appreciated. If you have time and the skills, consider volunteering for a post and working with our team. Summary Job Descriptions

Vice President: Responsibilities include networking with artists, scheduling monthly show artist demonstrators for a nine-month schedule. This requires searching for potential artists and photographers. Sends out email communications and guidelines to demonstrators. Provides demonstrator schedules, bios and images for monthly newsletter and marketing. For Spring Art show, schedules, two show judges.

Secretary: Responsibilities include note taking or audio recording the monthly board meetings from September through May. Transcribing the notes or audio into a written record of meeting minutes. Emailing meeting minutes to the board members after the meeting. This position would start in the fall.

Membership: Responsibilities include managing membership subscriptions and renewals. This includes collecting new membership applications, renewals, and payments. Maintaining a roster list of active members for use in communications, membership, and marketing. Updating addresses and emails on roster periodically as needed. Sending out welcome emails to new members using automated templates.

Newsletter: Responsibilities include gathering monthly announcements and information for newsletter publication. Requires newsletter journalistic style writing and editing. Knowledge of MS Word or Google newsletter template use. Conversion to Adobe PDF file and upload to Google drive. Ability to download and resize photos. The completed newsletter is emailed to all members and non-members who are interested in receiving it. Management of email database lists for members and non-members.
