Come check out her amazing and fascinating photography which will be presented as a journey through locations and images.

Debbie Strong has lived in the City of Yucaipa for more than 25 years. She is a freelance photographer whose work has been featured in Joshua Tree Voice, Yucaipa News Mirror, Living with Wildfire magazine editions, and an art gallery exhibit in downtown Los Angeles.

Debbie retired as a fire captain from CAL FIRE in 2018, after a rewarding 30-year career in the fire service. Debbie is working on the second chapter of her life by embracing storytelling, starting with her camera in hand, poetry and journaling as she travels to various countries, capturing stunning landscapes, street photography and astrophotography images. Debbie has traveled extensively abroad and around Canada.

She was fortunate to be mentored by amazing, talented photographers - Casey Kiernan, a Documentary Filmmaker from Joshua Tree, CA and Scott Robert Lim a Sony Artisan from Los Angeles, CA and Rachel Jones Ross, a Sony Artisan from Alberta, Canada. 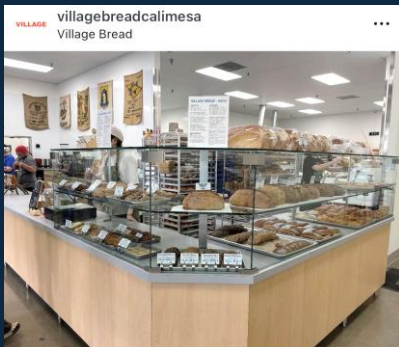

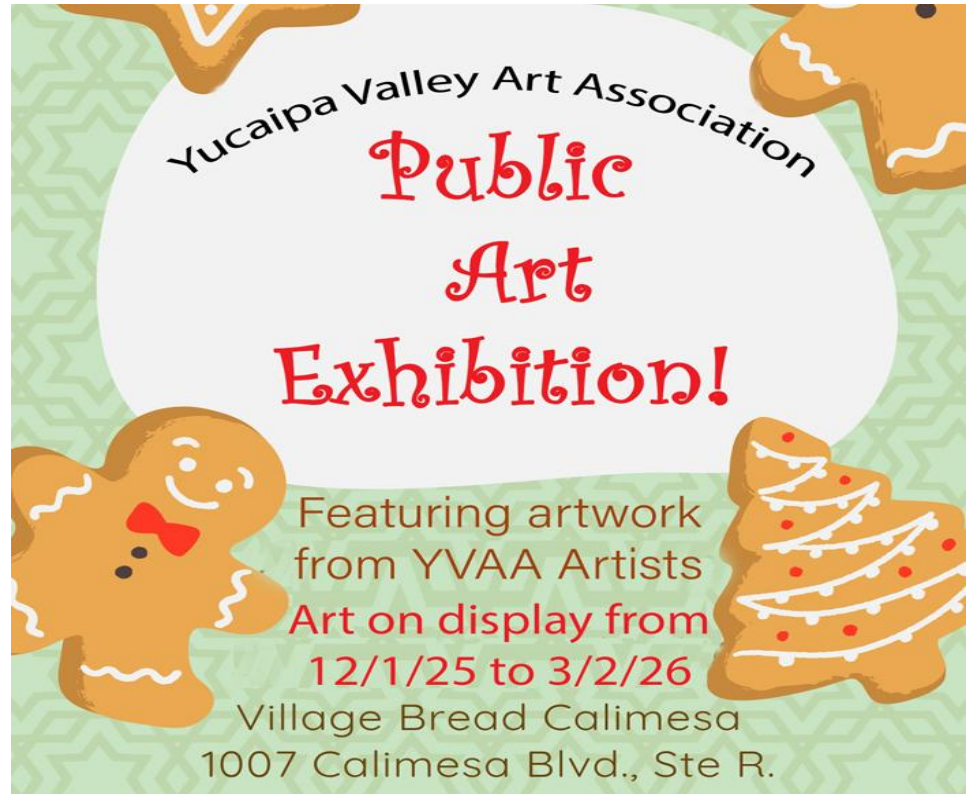

Summary Job Descriptions

Secretary: Responsibilities include note taking or audio recording the monthly board meetings from September through May. Transcribing the notes or audio into a written record of meeting minutes. Emailing meeting minutes to the board members after the meeting. This position would start in the fall.

Membership: Responsibilities include managing membership subscriptions and renewals. This includes collecting new membership applications, renewals, and payments. Maintaining a roster list of active members for use in communications, membership, and marketing. Updating addresses and emails on roster periodically as needed. Sending out welcome emails to new members using automated templates.

Newsletter: Responsibilities include gathering monthly announcements and information for newsletter publication. Requires newsletter journalistic style writing and editing. Knowledge of MS Word or Google newsletter template use. Conversion to Adobe PDF file and upload to Google drive. Ability to download and resize photos. The completed newsletter is emailed to all members and non-members who are interested in receiving it. Management of email database lists for members and non-members.
